
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SALESIAN FAMILY YOUTH CENTER 57 YEARS MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Our 2022-2023 school year for the We Care Program was the year of growth! We have served our largest number of students since 2019 and were able to grow both in size and in the program. We welcomed collaborations with various organizations such as the Two Bit Circus foundation, where students learned coding, to Renee Boulware's art classes. Our students continued their tutoring everyday while also having activities like Arts & amp; Crafts, STEM, Cooking, and GYM. We served our community during our Thanksgiving Luncheon and helped over 70 families during Christmas time to receive gifts. This was the inaugural year for our We Care Dance Club and our Recycle Club. We can't wait to see what the next school year brings our way!



Grade Percentages














Students attending our program




Percentage of Students by grades

Our core team has become crucial for fostering leadership and empowering our teens to take an active role in youth ministry. Finally, by partnering in community events, we are creating a positive impact but also building stronger connections with the wider community. We are working to ensure that we continue to be intentional about remaining responsive to the changing needs of those we serve.

COLLABORATIONS

Over the past four years, the Salesian Family Youth Center has successfully partnered with St. Mary's Church to enhance youth programs. This year we have expanded our partnership with St. Isabel Church, further extending our reach to serve the youth in our community. Additionally, the Salesian Family Youth Center has been actively working with the Salesian Provence Youth Ministry team, the St. Dominic Savio Core team, and the Los Angeles Archdioceses. These collaborative efforts have significantly contributed to the growth and impact of the youth programs in the area.


